GP Contract 2024/25 Imposition

Kent LMC, along with over 900 colleagues, attended the national GPC webinar regarding the GP Contract 24/25 imposition from NHSE. Further local webinars are due to take place and for colleagues who missed it the future BMA GPC Webinar dates are below:

It was helpful to understand from the GPC their position, when embarking on negotiations on your behalf, and the response from NHSE.

GPC England feel this contract will not help general practice or patients. They advised us over 1300 practices have been lost since September 2015. Inflation outstrips any uplift and it is a real terms cut that threatens more practice closures, more headlines around redundancies and GP unemployment, more patients losing 'their GP' and 'their practice'.

The GPC want to hear what you think, this webinar is open to ALL GPs delivering the contract, including registrars and locums and Practice Managers.

The referendum is open to all BMA Members and is impartial and objective. This is a national contract, so must be led by our national trade union, the BMA. The referendum closes on the 27th March and is followed by a GPC meeting on the 28th March.

The referendum question is:

Do you accept the 2024/25 GMS contract for General Practice from Government and NHS England? Answer - Yes or No

We were also advised that this referendum is an opportunity to have your say as a profession, as General Practitioners, with every single GP, whether partner, salaried, locum or a GP registrar, eligible to vote. Kent LMC is setting up a Broadcast only WhatsApp Group to enable us to pass on important information from the BMA regarding the 2024-25 GP Contract Referendum. GP Absence Financial Support

Practices are reminded that they are able to claim financial support for the cost of backfill for Salaried and Partner GP absence including sickness absence and parental leave (paternity, maternity, adoption). Cover for an absent GP can be provided by a locum, another GP already employed in the practice or by Advanced Clinical Practitioners. Advanced Clinical Practitioner must have an advanced scope of practice, and this will need to be agreed in advance of the claim with the ICB Primary Care Contracting Team.

Phased returns are eligible for support, as long as the absent GP has a fit note that recommends a phased return, or an occupational health report and will be covered up to the maximum weekly amount or the actual costs incurred. The maximum weekly amount can be claimed for absent part-time GP's and should not be pro-rated in line with the working pattern of the absent GP. End to Visa Sponsorship Licence Renewal

From 6 April 2024 employers will no longer need to renew their sponsorship licence. The Home Office has announced that from 6 April 2024, employers that already hold a sponsorship licence will no longer be required to apply for a licence renewal after four years. There is no action needed for employers. If a practice has a sponsorship licence that is due to expire on or after this date, the Home Office will automatically extend the expiry date on the licence by 10 years.

This is the latest development as part of the ongoing work to transform the sponsorship system and will help reduce visa sponsorship related admin and costs for practices.

GP Appointments in Kent & Medway January 2023

The LMC has updated the GP Appointments in Kent & Medway poster and it is available to download from the Communicating with Patients section of our website to help practices evidence to patients the amount of work being carried out, and the pressures faced, by general practice, and the steps patients can take to help themselves manage their care. Practices may wish to display this in their waiting rooms or add to their websites and social media sites. The data is sourced from NHS digital. The next update will be published soon after the next release of GP appointments data.

General Practice Alert State (GPAS) National Reporting Dashboard

The national GPAS reporting dashboard has been published and shows the pressure general practice is under. Last week Kent & Medway practices reported GPAS Red/Opel 4. Thank you to practices that continue to provide input into GPAS on a weekly basis. The information you provide is invaluable in evidencing the pressure general practice is operating under. The GPAS information from the national dashboard will be used by the BMA and feed into contract negotiations.

Submissions continue to be completely anonymised. The LMC is not able to identify individual practices from the submissions. The only data that is shared with either the ICB or other stakeholders is aggregated at HCP or Kent and Medway level. The more practices that take part in GPAS, the more robust the evidence will be. Collecting this data is assisting the LMC in illustrating operational pressures in general practice. The report takes less than 5 minutes to complete each week.

We would encourage every practice to submit a report on weekly basis and to also provide comments and feedback. Furthermore, if you are experiencing acute operational pressures please do get in touch with either the LMC or the ICB to seek support
