Clinical Advice & Support

Referral to treatment (RTT) measurement

There have been some enquiries about what RTT means for patients who decide not to proceed with medical hospital procedures during COVID-19 and whether they would be discharged back to general practice.

The NHS published Referral to treatment (RTT) measurement and COVID-19 on 24 March providing advice that: "If a patient cancels, rearranges or postpones their appointment, this has no effect on the RTT clock, which should continue to tick. Patients should not be discharged back to their GP simply because they have cancelled or rearranged appointments; this should always be a clinical decision, based on the individual patient's best clinical interest."

COVID-19 and Mental Health Challenges in Practice webinar – 16 June

Dentistry

Some, though not all, dental practices started to open for face-to-face treatment from 8 June. The exact opening dates for practices and the range of services they will be able to offer will vary depending on the measures they have managed to put in place and the availability of staff following risk assessments.

Safeguarding

Kent Safeguarding Children Multi-Agency Partnership

As we are all aware there are concerns across the health and care system in Kent and Medway about the impact of the current situation on the mental wellbeing of young people. To support clinical colleagues in addressing these challenging issues, please see the attached June newsletter from the Kent Safeguarding Children Multi-Agency Partnership including an offer of free virtual Youth Suicide Awareness Prevention training sessions on various dates.

The partnership has also updated their Support Level Guidance Sheets. The language used allows the assessment of risk from the child's viewpoint and in addition a section has been added to cover external risks outside the home. There is also a flowchart to further help when assessing a family for referral for support.

Safeguarding Fabulous Fortnight

Practice managers have been sent information about a series of safeguarding training webinars on subjects like "School Health and Trauma Informed Practice" and "Bereavement". They will be taking place over the next two weeks.



Infection Prevention & Control

Antibody testing

We are aware that there are national discussions taking place with regard to antibody tests. We will update further when we have heard any outcomes.

Ordering personal protective equipment (PPE)

We have been told that throughout May and June 2020, the Department of Health and Social Care has been emailing GP practices, inviting them to register with a new PPE portal that has been developed in partnership with eBay UK, NHS Supply Chain, the Army, Clipper and Royal Mail. The new portal is for ordering PPE from a central inventory. This is to supplement (not replace) the wholesale supply route that already operates.

Current order limits mean GP practices can order one combined pack, containing 50 IIR masks, 200 aprons and 200 pairs of gloves per week (or up to this amount of separate items). These limits may change over time. Orders through the portal should arrive within 48 hours if placed before 1pm. Orders placed after 1pm will be subject to an additional 24-hours.

The emails asking you to register should be coming from PPE Dedicated Supply Channel - ppe.dedicated.supply.channel@notifications.service.gov.uk. Please make sure that you are regularly checking your email accounts registered with the CQC/MHRA in order to ensure that the invite is received and actioned. All staff survey

Kent and Medway Clinical Commissioning Group has launched a survey for all staff in all sectors to gather learning from COVID-19.

The platform includes resources for carers such as videos and guides, a carer's passport, and resources for line managers of carers.
