Clinical advice and support

King's College Hospital GP Liver ECHO programme

King's hepatology service is using <u>Project ECHO - Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes</u> to deliver a <u>series of seminars to GPs</u> this autumn. The first one on 21 September is about "Deranged liver function tests/when to refer/interpreting viral serology" but GPs who are interested in taking part are asked to register by 14 September.

Throughout the pandemic, health inequalities across the UK became more apparent. For Cardiovascular Disease (CVD), health inequalities are prominent and account for more than a quarter of deaths in England. Fire at IT data centre

The fire at a data centre in London last Thursday (27 August) affected IT networks across the UK, including some 90 per cent of GP practices in Kent

and Medway. After the fire service attended the site power was restored. This meant that the vast majority of GP practices were back online by the end of the day.

NELCSU and the CCG teams worked well together to resolve the network issues that were caused by the fire. The network service is provided by a commercial supplier and as with all such incidents there will be a review to look at what improvements can be made to our business continuity plans. GP practices are encouraged to do the same.

Digital Pioneer fellowship

The <u>Digital Pioneer Fellowship programme</u> supports NHS employees in London and the South East to design and lead transformation projects underpinned by digital innovation. Now in its third consecutive year, the 12-month programme provides up to 30 Fellows with the opportunity to be part of a learning community focussed on accelerating the pace of digital transformation within their respective NHS organisations. The individuals taking part have access to workshops, resources and events throughout the year to share challenges and experience, learn from experts and collaborate to co-design solutions.

Kent Community Foundation
