Introducing your new medical records movement service

NHS England has asked Primary Care Support England (PCSE) to introduce a new medical records movement service for all GP practices in England, that:

- Is more secure
- Ensures patient confidentiality
- Improves the time it takes for records to be transferred between practices
- Provides practices with a way of tracking record movements.

The new service has been thoroughly tested through a pilot in West Yorkshire, and has started to be rolled out to all GP practices nationally in phases. Phase one went live in July 2017, covering GP practices in the North of England and the East Midlands, and phase two went live in October 2017 in the West Midlands.

Your practice is in phase three of the rollout and the new records movement process will be introduced to your practice on week commencing 4 December 2017.

How your practice can prepare for the new service

Before the introduction of the new service it is important that you check your clinical system and continue to release any records deducted before 9am on 25 November 2017. Please hold on to any records deducted after this date as you will receive a label for them in due course.

Please also check that you have access to PCSE Online, as you will need to use it as part of the new service. If you don't yet have a login for PCSE Online, your practice 'main user' will be able to create a login for you.

Guidance and support with the new process

PCSE has produced a range of materials to help guide you through the new process and answer any queries you may have. In this pack we have included:

- A guide to the new process of sending and receiving medical records, and submitting and receiving temporary resident forms (also known as GMS3 forms)
- Guidelines which take you step by step through the process of packing medical records ready for movement, and
- A timetable detailing what is changing and when.
