


Firearms Licensing Process

General Practitioner

Applicant

Applicant download Standardised Medical Information Proforma and submit to GP



Applicant receives three month reminder

5 Years

If a relevant medical condition develops then the GP/Applicant MUST inform the Police for re-assessment Review patient notes to identify any **relevant medical conditions**, including:

Acute stress reaction as a result of trauma

Suicidal thoughts or self-harm

Depression and anxiety

Dementia

Personality disorder

Any severe neurological impairment

Alcohol and drug abuse

Mania, bipolar disorder or psychotic illness

Any other mental or physical condition that may affect safe possession of a firearm or shotgun

GP inserts SnoMed flag into notes

Firearms license granted letter sent to

Applicant & GP

Firearms License declined

Police risk

assessment

GP completes form for a fee (practice to decide) Scan completed copy into GP notes

Completed proforma submitted to Kent Police by applicant.

Police

Police receive request, including any relevant medical conditions identified by applicant or GP

Further medical information required Police pay GP fee
