Rebuild General Practice – national campaign in support of general practice

The BMA and LMCs will today be launching a new public communications campaign titled 'Rebuild General Practice'.

Negative media stories and lack of government support has created a toxic environment in general practice that is driving staff to leave. There is a compelling need to create a better environment for general practice, to reset the narrative and to rebuild relationships .

The campaign hopes to secure:

- Better retention and more junior doctors becoming GPs
- Improved public understanding of what GPs do
- More neutral media and reports of systemic issues
- More support for GPs' wellbeing
- Government delivers on its workforce commitments

Enhanced Service Specification COVID-19 vaccination programme: phase 3 2021/22 and phase 4 2022/23

General practice has played a critical role in the success of phase 1 (the vaccination of patient cohorts 1-9) and phase 2 (the vaccination of patient cohorts 10-12) of the COVID-19 vaccination programme.

The next phase of the COVID-19 vaccination programme offers revaccination boosters (with additional vaccine) for those at the highest risk, to maintain protection against the risk of severe illness, and continue to offer vaccinations to those Patients which did not take up or were previously not eligible to receive vaccination in phases 1 and 2.

The COVID-19 vaccination programme: phase 3 will be delivered alongside the seasonal influenza vaccination programme, which runs each autumn. Together, the vaccinations will offer those at highest risk safe and effective protection against the risk of COVID-19 and seasonal influenza.

The general practice COVID-19 vaccination programme: phase 3 service will be commissioned in line with agreed national terms and conditions as an Enhanced Service (ES) directed by NHS England. The ES has been offered to all GP practices and is not capable of amendment by CCGs.

Safe Working in General Practice

General practice is in crisis, with increasing patient need and demand, coupled with a shrinking and exhausted workforce, as well as a vast backlog of care following from the COVID-19 pandemic, exerting greater pressure on a system already at breaking point.

As a result of these challenges, GPCE has published a safe working guide to enable practices to prioritise safe patient care, within the present bounds of the GMS contract. Present resource in general practice is finite, though we must continue to deliver high quality, safe care to our patients. It may be the case that some patients will regrettably wait longer to access GP care for their non-urgent problems, or are directed to another more appropriate provider.

Kent and Medway System Staff Covid-19 Risk Assessment: Contact with Positive Covid-19- V4.0

Kent and Medway system has updated the System Staff Risk Assessment. Please bear in mind that the information on the risk assessment is subject to change if new guidance is published by end of March 2022.

The latest version includes the following updates:

- To be in line with the latest guidance for health and social care workers updated on 24th February 2022
- Included a section for staff who receive inconclusive PCR test results
- Changed COVID-19 Vaccination comment (see Part 4, no. 18)
- Included "Immunocompetent Health and Social Care Staff" in Outcome 2
- Removed information that no longer apply

Delay to Online Access to Records

We have been informed that the Online Access to Patient Records launch has been delayed from April 2022 to 1 July 2022. Further updates will follow as soon as possible.

Lateral Flow Tests

You will be aware that access to free lateral flow tests will cease from the end of March 2022. With high levels of confirmed Covid cases in the community, practices may consider it prudent to advise staff to request lateral flow tests while they are still available free.

Lateral flow tests can still be ordered here.

Lateral flow tests can also be picked up from pharmacies, while stocks last. More details can be found <u>here</u>. You may need to try and access at different times of the day/evening.

Practitioners Health Programme

Due to the pressures of the pandemic the practitioners health programme (PHP) has been opened up to other practice staff, not just GPs. Staff should access local wellbeing services if they are able.
