

Teaching Safety-Netting Webinar

Safety-netting skills are considered essential for safe practice. Many clinicians have received little or no formal training in safety-netting skills and patients report that safety-netting advice is vague and unhelpful.

This session is for practicing clinicians and medical educators and will cover:

- Understanding the principles and purpose of safety-netting advice
- Tools to improve the delivery of safety-netting advice in different consultations
 - The 6-C's decision-making tool
 - SAFER tool for creating the medical content
 - Visual tools to enhance the patient content
 - SBAR tool for verbal delivery.



Dr Paul Silverston trained as a paramedic in San Francisco before becoming a GP in Newmarket, where he worked for 20 years in a career that combined family practice with pre-hospital care and medical education. In 2012, he became Senior Lecturer in Clinical Assessment and Minor Illness Teaching at Anglia Ruskin University, where he developed the Specialist Paramedic in Primary Care and SAFER Consulting in Minor Illness for Community Pharmacists Programmes. He is currently Visiting Professor of Primary Care at the University of Suffolk and a Visiting Professor at Anglia Ruskin University, where he is developing the Primary Care in Paramedic Training Programme.
