## GPAS (General Practice Alert State) Webinar

## PSA Monitoring

We can confirm that practices can claim for patients transferred to Primary Care for PSA monitoring from February 2022. Practices only need evidence of the patient being transferred to primary care to be eligible to claim.

The ICB will confirm a pathway for practices to claim for patients that are receiving PSA monitoring in general practice where they do not have evidence of the transfer.

# Spirometry

The service is currently undergoing a 'soft launch'. Practices that are currently providing diagnostic Spirometry for their patients can claim for any activity delivered from the beginning of May 2022. Practices are advised to record the activity and inform the ICB. The ICB will produce a spirometry template on Ardens that will code activity on patient records which Apex will use, automating the claiming process on for practices.

### Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells Duplicate Results

Over the last 10 days practices have been affected by technical issues with MTW's Pathology results system which caused practices to receive large numbers of duplicate results. the ICB wants to understand the scale and impact of the incident on practices. Therefore please write to <u>kmccg.wkicc@nhs.net</u> with the following information:

- Did you identify any potential safety issues and, if so, approximately how many?
- How much disruption did this cause? An approximation of which members of your team were involved in resolving the issue and how much time each spent would suffice here.

#### COVID-19 Autumn booster and flu vaccine programme expansion
