Kent LMC Annual Conference Report 2022

General Practice Alert System (GPAS) role out for practices in Kent & Medway - drop in virtual question and answer session - 16th November 2022

Thank you to those who submitted their GPAS data last week. Please continue to return data each week, as this is crucial in enabling the LMC to demonstrate to system partners the pressure that general practice is under, and how the system can respond to pressure in general practice.

We have submitted a consolidated view of the first 5 weeks date to the ICB and await their response.

Currently only 78% of practices have engaged and are able to submit their data. We are keen to ensure that every practice is represented, so if you have not yet responded to our request and are not currently submitting data please could you forward details of your nominated contact as soon as possible to <u>info@kentlmc.org</u>.

GPAS submissions are anonymous to the LMC so if a practice declares their status as black, then we would ask they contact the LMC at <u>info@kentlmc.org</u> so that support can be offered.

We are also keen to hear from practices that are rating their state as Green. It would be helpful to understand what steps practices have been able to take to operate as Green and so ask that Green state practices add a comment to their weekly submission as any shared learning would be extremely valuable.

We appreciate there may be questions that practices have about completing and submitting the weekly template or about how the data is used so please join us <u>via microsoft teams</u> for a questions and answer webinar session on Wednesday 16th November at 12.30pm. This will be an opportunity to ask any questions about GPAS and can include advice on getting started. We will also share reports we have produced, based on submission so far.

Urgent action required: Patient Access to GP records 1st November 2022

As the date for switch on approaches imminently it appears there are multiple concerns not fully addressed by the current proposed scheme. We have been awaiting a BMA update which has not been forthcoming. In addition, the LMC has received **no** assurances that our system in Kent & Medway partners (Hospital Trusts, Community Trust. Mental Health Trusts etc) are prepared for this automated switch on.

Therefore, we recommend practices consider pausing this automatic activation by emailing EMIS (as data processors) on: aapostpone@emishealth.com. A template BMA drafted letter that practices can use can be found HERE. This does not prevent the current system of allowing patients to access their records but would stop the mass automatic switch on from 1st November. We do not believe this would trigger a breach of GMS contract as long as practices continue to allow patients to access online records in their current manner. We await a further statement from the BMA this week, following discussions with NHSE /Information Commissioner's Office, National Data Guardians office /legal counsel.

A Message from NHS Kent & Medway: Common themes and trends within CQC inspection reports - When an Inspector Calls

Specialist teams (Quality Assurance and Improvement; Medicines Management; Safeguarding Children and Adults; Looked After Children; Infection prevention and Control; Patient Safety and Learning; Training Hub/Workforce) within NHS Kent and Medway have identified common themes and trends within CQC inspection reports across Kent and Medway and have worked in collaboration to develop a support tool to assist practices to improve their internal governance processes, whether directly, or indirectly, to improve patient safety and care.

Within the document, you will find recommendations to assist your practice to move towards/achieve compliance, and a check list to self-assess your systems and processes within your practice and identify areas of low or non-compliance, to action. The list is by no means exhaustive – visit the CQC website for further information around regulatory compliance <u>Regulations for service providers and managers - Care Quality Commission</u> (cqc.org.uk).
