

England on Accelerating Citizen Access to GP Data (1 November 2022).

• Z1ZA (4) states:


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- (4) But the contractor may—
 - (a) delay providing the facility to P, if the contractor considers that providing P with it is likely to have an adverse impact on its provision of essential services;
- (b) delay giving P online access to any information added to P's prospective medical record after the facility is provided to P, if the contractor considers that providing P with access to that information is likely to have an adverse impact on its provision of essential services.



GPAS Kent & Medway 24th October 2022

- General practice is under pressure. The overall <u>GPAS rating</u> for Kent and Medway is AMBER.
- 77% of responding practices are unable to fully meet patient demand, and are working beyond recommended safe working limits.
- 21% of practices have declared they may only be able to maintain safe services for a brief period of time without support and intervention.
- 80% of practices have signed up to GPAS
- Overall Response Rate of 62% based on practices who have signed up to GPAS (half term week)





What should a practice do now ?

If **both** of the following apply to you, then **no action** is required

- 1. You have risk assessed your entire patient list and applied SNOMED code "104" to any at risk patients
- 2. You are content that the automatic unilateral granting of access to all such patients on your list poses no medicolegal or GDPR risk to your practice



What should a practice do now ?

- If you do **NOT** meet the criteria then the LMC advises the following options are available to practices:
- Write to the Data Processor ; EMIS instructing them to not turn on prospective online access. This must be done before 5pm, Friday 4th November. Delays until 30th November.
- **Bulk "104":** The option remains for practices to apply the SNOMED code "104" (1364731000000104) **to every patient on their list** prevents the automated script set to run by system providers having any effect on any patient's record.
 - "accepting" the offer and choosing to opt-in, need only be provided the service "as soon as possible" in a safe way with informed consent. No deadline can be imposed under the current contract by which practices would need to "undo" this
