GPAS Update - Submission to National Dashboard

Thank you to all practices that continue to provide a weekly a submission. The information you provide is invaluable in evidencing the pressure general practice is operating under.

The Kent GPAS report is now included in a National GPAS reporting dashboard and we will need to submit our Opel Status (GPAS state) into the national dashboard by 2pm every Thursday so we would ask that all practices complete their GPAS submission by Wednesday of each week. Submissions continue to be completely anonymised. The LMC is not able to identify individual practices from the submissions. The only data that is shared with either the ICB or other stakeholders is aggregated at HCP or Kent and Medway level. The more practices that take part in GPAS, the more robust the evidence will be. Collecting this data is assisting the LMC in illustrating operational pressures in general practice. The report takes less than 5 minutes to complete each week.

We would encourage every practice to submit a report on weekly basis and to provide comments and feedback.

New to Partnership Payment Scheme (N2PP) – deadline for applications

The N2PP scheme was introduced in July 2020 for an anticipated two years. In December 2021, NHS England extended the scheme into 2023.

GPs and other clinical staff intending to apply for the scheme need to have entered into an equity partnership by 31 March 2023 to be able to **submit an application by 30 June 2023**. A Message from NHS Kent & Medway: Changes to vascular services

As previously communicated, all primary care referrals for vascular services for patients in Medway, Maidstone and east Kent are now to be made to East Kent Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (EKHUFT) and will be managed by the Kent and Medway Vascular Network.

This move follows a decision last year by NHS commissioners to bring together inpatient vascular services at Kent and Canterbury and Medway Maritime hospitals, and for vascular teams across east Kent, Medway, and Maidstone areas to work together as one team - the Kent and Medway Vascular Network.

All patients requiring inpatient vascular treatment in the Medway, Maidstone and east Kent areas will be treated at Kent and Canterbury Hospital. The inpatient service transitions in a phased way throughout April and May.

Patients will continue to access vascular outpatient clinics and diagnostic tests at their local hospitals in Medway, Maidstone, Ashford, Canterbury and Margate. Day surgery will continue at both Medway and Canterbury hospitals. Patients in the Tunbridge Wells area will continue to access inpatient care in London and outpatient care locally.

If you are a GP in Medway, east Kent or the Maidstone area of west Kent please select EKHUFT on the NHS e-Referral Service (e-RS) when referring patients to vascular services, and not a London hospital.

set up a dedicated phoneline for the Kent and Medway Vascular Network, which we hope to be able to advertise next week.

How to obtain a Tier 2 Sponsorship Licence

Obtaining a Tier 2 Sponsorship Licence is a route for employing non-European Economic Area (non-EEA) clinicians wanting to work in the UK. However, quite understandably, the bureaucracy involved can be somewhat off putting. Fortunately, Sharon Lee, Senior Primary Care Workforce Programme Lead for Kent and Medway ICB, is available to provide guidance on how to navigate the process. If you are considering obtaining a Tier 2 Sponsorship Licence then contact Sharon via sharonlee2@nhs.net. Sharon has helped many practices to obtain a Tier 2 licence.

Sharon has recently helped City Way Surgery (Rochester) to secure the Licence and Galya Apostolova, GP Partner, had the following to say:

"Sharon advised and assisted us through the process of making the application. She has a PowerPoint presentation that is very informative and guides applicants through the application process step by step. Sharon was also available to meet and provide guidance where we needed it".

We encourage practices to consider tier 2 sponsorship to support their recruitment plans.
