Practice may have recently received a letter from KCC regarding ReferKent

ReferKent - for organisations who support Kent residents - Kent County Council is a programme that is running alongside the Digital Kent initiative (the LMC had an item on that in the weekly bulletin of 31st July 2023) in the Financial Hardship Programme at KCC. The GDPR compliant online referral system is for adults only and aims to strengthen referrals across Kent for adults and families who are affected by the cost-of-living crisis, there are many useful services to refer patients to from addiction support to homelessness services.

Invicta Training

The Invicta staff training team will be contacting practices to ask for clarification of which staff registered on Learning Pool are ARRS staff, or staff employed by a local Federation, rather than being employed directly by a practice. There has been a significant increase in the demand for some training and it would be helpful to understand what factors are driving the demand so that training can be tailored appropriately going forward, and so we would ask that all practices please provide this information to the Invicta team when requested.

General Practice Alert State (GPAS) National Reporting Dashboard

The national GPAS reporting dashboard has been published and shows the pressure general practice is under. Last week Kent & Medway practices reported Opel 4.

Thank you to practices that continue to provide input into GPAS on a weekly basis. The information you provide is invaluable in evidencing the pressure general practice is operating

under. The GPAS information from the national dashboard will be used by the BMA and feed into contract negotiations.

Submissions continue to be completely anonymised. The LMC is not able to identify individual practices from the submissions. The only data that is shared with either the ICB or other stakeholders is aggregated at HCP or Kent and Medway level. The more practices that take part in GPAS, the more robust the evidence will be. **Collecting this data is assisting the LMC in illustrating operational pressures in general practice. The report takes less than 5 minutes to complete each week.**

We would encourage every practice to submit a report on weekly basis and to also provide comments and feedback. Furthermore, if you are experiencing acute operational pressures please do get in touch with either the LMC or the ICB to seek support
