BMA GPC England Contract Update

The BMA GPC has given its view on the current 24-25 contract offer of a 1.9% uplift as inadequate, putting patients and staffing levels at risk. Please see the 2 minute video update from the BMA GPC Chair, Dr Katie Bramall-Stainer, on their next steps and why GPs may want to join the BMA to ensure they have a say on the contract which will be put out to referendum by the BMA this month.

Supporting Your Care for Children with Asthma

The ICB are requesting views on childhood asthma, there are a number of questions regarding FeNO testing and we would like to remind practices that this is not commissioned or funded by the ICB currently.

NHS Kent and Medway is keen to understand the confidence and needs of local healthcare professionals with responsibility for caring for children with suspected or confirmed asthma. If you care for children with asthma, please complete this short survey that will enable us to understand the current use of asthma diagnostic testing in primary care and how we can best support this in the future through education and training.

This is part of the work led by Dr Faye Hinsley, in response to the NHS' ambition to reduce avoidable harm to children and young people from asthma. Your feedback would be much appreciated.

General Practice Alert State (GPAS) National Reporting Dashboard

The national GPAS reporting dashboard has been published and shows the pressure general practice is under. Last week Kent & Medway practices reported Opel 4.

Thank you to practices that continue to provide input into GPAS on a weekly basis. The information you provide is invaluable in evidencing the pressure general practice is operating under. The GPAS information from the national dashboard will be used by the BMA and feed into contract negotiations.

Submissions continue to be completely anonymised. The LMC is not able to identify individual practices from the submissions. The only data that is shared with either the ICB or other stakeholders is aggregated at HCP or Kent and Medway level. The more practices that take part in GPAS, the more robust the evidence will be. **Collecting this data is assisting the LMC in illustrating operational pressures in general practice. The report takes less than 5 minutes to complete each week.**

We would encourage every practice to submit a report on weekly basis and to also provide comments and feedback. Furthermore, if you are experiencing acute operational pressures please do get in touch with either the LMC or the ICB to seek support The LMC is able to assist with getting practices started on reporting.
