Speaker Profiles

Professor Chris Holland **Foundation Dean, Kent & Medway Medical School**

Professor Chris Holland is the Foundation Dean of the Kent and Medway Medical School (KMMS). He also works as an Adult Intensive Care Consultant at King's College Hospital and will be moving his clinical practice to Kent or Medway. He has worked in education for over a decade including other medical schools, startup education innovations and with national education bodies, the General Medical Council and international educational enterprises. He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Anaesthetists, the Faculty of Intensive Care, and the Academy of Medical Educators. He was also an elected member of the National Council of the Academy of Medical Educators and led the Academy's Equality and Diversity Group until his appointment as Foundation Dean.

Professor Holland joined the KMMS from the University of Surrey where he was a Professorial Teaching Fellow and Director of Learning and Teaching for Medicine, responsible for learning and teaching and student experience for Medicine at the University. Chris' vision for KMMS is that it will bring together the existing centres of excellence in health and medical education provided by the two universities, and local healthcare organisations, to offer a new model of patient-focused medical education. It will also be an essential part of the solution to the challenge of recruiting and retaining medical professionals for the region. The medical school will open in September 2020, offering 100 undergraduate medical places on a yearly basis. The five-year undergraduate programme will be taught at the Canterbury campuses of both university partners with medical placements within Primary, Community and Secondary Care across Kent and Medway.



Dr Farah Jameel **GPC Executive Team**

Dr Farah Jameel is a member of the executive team of the British Medical Association's General Practitioners Committee of England (GPC England). Her responsibilities through this role include negotiating the annual GP contract in England, representing General Practice and leading on national policy issues including those relating to clinical and prescribing, Quality Outcomes Framework, GPIT and Workload management. Farah was part of the team responsible for negotiating the 2019 English GP contract.

Farah grew up in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and has had experience of training and working across the healthcare system in the UAE and has also spent time training and working in India at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences. She brings her clinical experience as a practising GP in London to influence national health policy, strategy and implementation. She is regularly featured in the GP trade press as one of the top 50 most influential GP's in the UK and has also won an award for effective leadership.



Dr Jonty West **Clinical Appraisal Lead, NHS England and NHS Improvement South East Region**

Jonty West is the Clinical Appraisal Lead for NHS England and NHS Improvement South East Region (Kent, Surrey and Sussex). This role includes overseeing the appraisal workforce and being responsible for quality assurance of the appraisal and revalidation processes in the area. He has been involved in appraisal since 2007, and became Senior Appraiser covering West Kent appraisers in 2012.

He is a GP in West Malling in West Kent, and a GP trainer, and was Training Programme Director for Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells GPVTS until 2018.



Keira Moulds **Head of Primary Care Commissioning (Quality and Regulation)** **Operations & Information Directorate**

I am really pleased to introduce myself as part of this team, as I think it's a great team to work in and a great area of the health sector to focus on. The major part of my role has been general practice indemnity; working with DHSC and other system partners to understand the impact of rising indemnity costs, and working to bring about a wholesale system change. This project helps NHS England fulfil one of the commitments made in the GP Forward View that general practitioners should not be financially worse off than secondary care doctors. We have worked to create a state backed indemnity scheme, which should hopefully assist general practice as it transforms for the future. I am a solicitor by background and have worked in other system regulators, looking at social care, secondary health and primary care.

Outside of work I am a keen horse rider and swimmer, with a bit of a passion for good food. I am also a relatively new mum so there is never a dull moment in our house as our little one changes as a rate of knots, keeping us entertained (as well as sleep deprived!)
